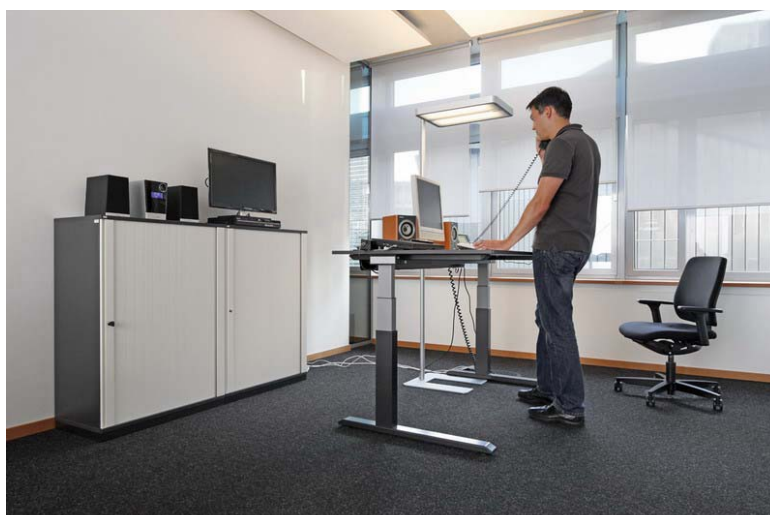


The media company SWR brought two locations of its offices together in one unit in the form of a new building in the direct vicinity of the existing broadcasting house. Radio, television and the Internet grow together here, whereby joint use of content is made possible by the latest technology. In the new building, which is connected to the "old" broadcasting house by a bridge, there are new workstations for 480 employees.

In addition to editing rooms, offices and graphics studios, there are radio and television studios, a news studio and a sound design studio in the core of the building. On the upper floors, the different editorial departments of SWR are accommodated. In the narrow, elongated building, high quality work areas have flexibly furnishable spaces and inspiring views of the greenery outside.



In the centre of each floor, central zones were created for office equipment, meeting islands or places for employees to rest such as spaces for making coffee and tea, whereby the colour red is used for accentuating purposes (see above). Photos: © Stephan Paul Stuemmer
